Application for High School Commuter Pass Subsidy Program



In September 2024, a subsidy program was introduced to assist with the cost of commuter passes for senior high school students who either live in Kobe City or attend school in the city. Applications submitted by parents or guardians are currently being accepted online through e-KOBE.

Eligible Persons:

 Senior high school students (and other students of equivalent education) who are registered as residents of Kobe during the eligibility period

 Senior high school students (and other students of equivalent education) who are between the ages of 16 and 18 years old within the applicable year

%There are no household income restrictions.

Apply: via electronic application (e-KOBE)

Application Deadline: Friday, April 11, 2025

Requirements for Application: Photo of school ID and the commuter pass for the eligibility period

As the new year is ushered in, traditional and religious ceremonies are held all over the city to ward off evil spirits, and to pray for protection, good health, safety, bountiful harvests, etc. Start 2025 with a refreshing feeling and come observe these traditions handed down from ancient times!

Tsuinashiki (Evil-Warding) Ceremony

Nagata Ward: Nagata Shrine (3 Nagata-cho) February 2 (Sunday) 12:30~18:00



Nagata Shrine (Prefecture designated important intangible folk cultural property)

At Nagata Shrine, there will be a performance of a family of seven demons, dancing vigorously onstage. The highlight of this Shinto ceremony is the final "Mochiwari Ceremony", in which the demons tirelessly smash a large rice cake with an axe and mallet.

There are six types of "demon dances" at Kinko-ji Temple. In the Flower Dance, demons dance holding artificial flowers; it is said that taking home some of the flowers used for the dance will ward off bad luck and evil spirits.
