# Kobe's public libraries

Libraries are not just for bookworms. They are an open “third space” for everyone where people can go besides home and the workplace.



## ① Ask a librarian, a pro at finding books

If you need help or are looking for a book, please ask a librarian. They will listen and help you find the right book.

## ② Reserve books with your smartphone

You'll receive an email when your reserved book becomes available. You can have the book sent to any of the city's 12 municipal libraries for pick-up.

## ③ Read e-books on your smartphone or laptop

If you're connected to the internet, you can check out books to read anytime, anywhere.

## ④ Read books that have been sterilized with a special machine

When you put your borrowed books in the book sterilizer, they are disinfected using UV light. A gust of air also hits the bottom of the book to remove any dust or debris trapped between the pages. Simply set the book inside and push the switch, and your book will be clean in 30 seconds.

# The unique public libraries in Kobe

**Higashinada Library:** Many seats for reading, including counter seating with a great outside view

**Nada Library:** Many local events by nearby universities, Rakugo clubs, and other groups. Movie days for kids on Mondays

**Chuo Library:** Approx. 1 million books and 500 seats. The largest library in the city

**Sannomiya Library:** Many art and design-related events

**Kita Library:** An extensive collection of interesting books about Kita Ward, including traditional performances and rural Kabuki theater

**Hokushin Library:** The library's concept is "field of books". You can "harvest" knowledge on sofas or in kid-friendly spaces

**Hyogo Library:** Satellite library, workshops, and other local events

**Shin-Nagata Library:** Many individual events, such as book clubs where you can express your thoughts about the book

**Suma Library:** A calming atmosphere of being surrounded by greenery. Includes a large children's book section and books useful for high school students

**Myodani Library:** Located in a department store. Stylish interior that evokes the warmth of Mt. Rokko

**Tarumi Library:** Illustrations of original fish characters greet you at the entrance, drawing the excitement of kids

**Nishi Library:** Relaxing, café-like vibe

**Bookmobile:** Visits neighborhoods in Kita and Nishi Wards that are far from the libraries once a month. Approx. 3,000 books in stock

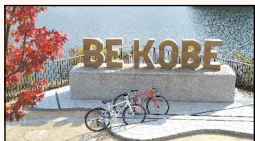
## Birth of a resort and leisure zone in June 2024

And the Kobe Suma Sea World Hotel will be the first hotel in Japan where you can interact with dolphins. You can also look forward to seeing a new BE KOBE monument in the park too.

## Cycle through autumn colors on the Kande-Yamada Cycling Road!

On this 19-km stretch of cycling road, you can enjoy delicious food spots as well as the majestic view of Tsukuhara Lake surrounded by rice fields and mountains.



Kobe City is offering bicycle rentals this autumn, including cross bikes and electric-assisted bicycles.

## Change your fire alarms every 10 years!

Fire alarms are effective for detecting fires as early as possible and preventing damage from spreading.

However, when they become too old, the sensor can break down and cause the device to stop working correctly. Be sure to test your fire alarm once every 6 months and replace it every 10 years.

**How to test your fire alarm:** Push the button or pull on the string. If the alarm is working correctly, it will produce either a “correctly working” message or a fire alarm noise.



(To stop the alarm, please wait until the fire alarm automatically stops ringing, push the button again, or pull on the string again.)

# Get advice from the Kobe Child Development Specialist Teams

With society's increasing understanding toward developmental disorders, there are more and more inquiries to specialist hospitals and clinics. To meet this increasing need, free consultations with a specialist team are available from October on a trial basis to residents of Tarumi and Nishi Wards.

Based on an interview and simple test, this team will give advice on interacting with your child, refer you to various support systems, and think with you on what other forms of support are appropriate for your family's situation.

**Eligibility:** Families of pre-elementary school aged-children who live in Tarumi or Nishi Ward.
